first generation home buyer \$25,000 down payment assistance

Time is of the essence. The state of Michigan has allocated 8 million dollars for this pilot program, and once the funds are gone, the program will end!

Homeownership is closer than it appears with the new Michigan State Housing Development Authority (MSHDA) Down Payment Assistance Program for first generation home buyers.

A “first generation home buyer” refers to an individual whose parents, or they themselves, have not owned a home within the last three years. The funds provided by this program can be used for closing costs, pre-pays, and the down payment itself. The Down Payment Assistance (DPA) funds are not “free” money – it’s a state loan at a zero percent interest rate that is paid back when the house is sold or the mortgage is refinanced.

- \$25,000 Down Payment Assistance
- Buyer must have at least 1% into transaction
- \$224,500 maximum sales price
- 640 minimum credit score
- Manufactured (double-wide) are acceptable
- Buyer must complete an in-person housing education class
